CRSI Adult Day Services is a program of choice for individuals who want to be involved in recreational and/or vocational habilitation activities.

ADULT DAY SUPPORT

Adult Day Support programs are based on individual choices and needs. Topic or subject-specific activities and outings are planned by the consumers on a weekly or monthly calendar. Staff will assist and coach individuals to participate in activities at their interest level and with accommodations as needed. As per HCBS Waiver Rule, Adult Day Support services will focus on assessments, personal care, reinforcement of existing skills, self-determination activities, recreation and leisure activities, and building social and community relationships.

Specific Adult Day Support Activities or topics may include:

Under the HCBS Waiver Rule, two distinctly different programs exist under one waiver.

Adult Day Support applies focus on leisure, recreational or non-work activities and services.



Vocational Habilitation maintains focus on work related services. Job training and development, supported employment, enclaves, mobile work crews and paid piece work all fall under the Vocational Habilitation part of the HCBS Waiver.

To bill for services provided under the HCBS Waiver, consumers must be out of school and eligible for MR/DD services, choose CRSI as their HCBS/Adult Day Services provider through the Free Choice of Provider Rule (5123:2-9-11), and the services CRSI provides must appear on the consumer's Individual Service Plan (ISP).

Transportation is provided under the HCBS Waiver, to and from the Adult Day Support or Vocational Habilitation sites. Individuals can choose to participate in CRSI Adult Day Support or Vocational Habilitation programs one to five days per week.

Adult Day Support and/or Vocational Habilitation services will be developed and provided by CRSI in specific counties based on the number of individuals seeking services and the type of services requested.



CRSI is CARF accredited in specified Employment Services. Services vary with each accreditation.

VOCATIONAL HABILITATION

Vocational Habilitation programs are tailored to individuals who have a focus on paid work and employment. Work based training and assessment can occur with the desired outcome of paid work. Mobile work crews offer paid work for consumers in a community setting as do enclaves. An enclave is a work crew with supervision performing work at the business site. An individual's community/supported employment can occur under the HCBS Waiver. All work done by consumers will be paid at minimum wage for hours worked.
